The tower is a symbol of singular wealth concentration, a concentration of power reminiscent of an ancient system of hereditary monarchy, justified by strong monotheistic beliefs. UAE ensured there was an amalgamation of culture and development through the culmination of this dream, brought to life by its competitive instinct within a longstanding structure of pride and dominance.

Timeline

1. Foundation

As the foundation was laid in January 2004, His Highness Shaikh Khalifa Bin Zayed Al Nahyan became president of the UAE. Thus, began the UAE's journey towards architectural excellence.

2. Transformation

The design is derived from Islamic architecture. As the tower rises from a flat desert base, there are 27 setbacks, a step-like recession used for the aesthetic purpose in a spiral pattern, decreasing the cross-section of the tower as going upward and creating convenient outdoor terraces. With each setback, designers and creators managed to realize a part of their dream. As UAE boasted of the completion of its 50th level of the Burj Khalifa in June 2006, His Highness Shaikh Mohammad Bin Rashid Al Maktoum became Vice-President and Prime

Minister of the UAE and Ruler of Dubai after the late Shaikh Maktoum Bin Rashid Al Maktoum, Vice-President and Prime Minister of UAE and Ruler of Dubai. With this changing of empires came the opportunity for over 6500 Emiratis to vote for the Federal National Council in the UAE's first election, and the National ID Card (Emirates ID) Project was launched by President Khalifa.

Upon construction of its historical 100th floor in January 2007, UAE opened the doors of two magnificent architectural wonders, Shaikh Zayed Grand Mosque in Abu Dhabi and Dubai Mall. With the completion of the 150th floor of "Burj Dubai", UAE went on to create the largest man-made structure.




Image 1: Burj Khalifa Height




Image 2: Burj Khalifa Floor Plan

3. Recession

Work on the Burj Dubai was delayed in November when 40,000 laborers went on strike for a week over pay and working conditions, as builders involved - experienced financial problems as the recession had struck the Globe. Sheikh Khalifa, the ruler of the United Arab Emirates, granted monetary aid and funding, thus resulting in changing of the name of Dubai Burj to "Burj Khalifa". Despite these obstructions, the spire was completed, and Burj Khalifa was nearing completion. On the other hand, another major project of the World's longest automated driverless train system and the first in the Gulf region was completed, and the "Dubai Metro" was launched.

4. Completion

The exterior of the Burj Khalifa was completed in October 2009 and opened to the public in January 2010 raising the bar of standards in the architecture arena, it was the recipient of the

2010 "Best Tall Building Middle East & Africa" award by the Council on Tall Buildings and Urban Habitat, going forth to win the award for best project of the year at the Middle East Architect Awards 2010 Awards.

With these achievements, one can draw a parallel between how beautifully the crafting, growth, and progress of the Burj Khalifa mimics the revolutionary transformation of the United Arab Emirates over those years - truly, no less than a miracle.

5. Beyond

Symbol of Solidarity

The Burj Khalifa is no stranger to displaying messages of solidarity. Through 2020, it lit up in the flag colors of various countries and displayed "We are with you", to empathize with the challenge of battling the Covid-19 Pandemic. Not limited to this, it has gained a reputation for being the embodiment of support, pictures of which are seen echoed around the world.

15th January 2020: Burj Khalifa lit up with the statement 'We can all help' and the hashtag #MatesHelpMates to show support for the Australian Bushfire Crisis.

2nd February 2020: It reflected the Chinese flag colors to support Beijing over the Covid-19 outbreak.

3rd February 2020: It paid tribute to NBA legend Kobe Bryant and daughter Gianna, who passed away in a helicopter crash.

16th March 2020: A spotlight was focused on Italy, one of the hardest-hit nations from the COVID- 19 pandemic.

The UAE's symbolic act reinforces its humanitarian values and willingness to offer all support to different countries and its people in times of distress.
